DO BRING!

- » Acids
- » Aluminum
- » Antifreeze
- » Batteries
- » Brake and transmission fluid
- » Cleaning products
- » Lawn and garden chemicals
- » Lighter fluid
- » Paints, solvents and varnish
- » Pesticides and herbicides

DON'T BRING!

- » Agricultural chemicals
- » Ammunition
- » Asbestos-containing materials
- » Compressed gases
- » Containers larger than 5 gallons
- » Dioxins
- » Explosives and fireworks
- » Industrial, commercial or business waste
- » Medical and pharmaceutical items
- » Propane cylinders
- » Radioactive materials
- » Tires

PLEASE KEEP IN MIND

- » Bring products in original containers if possible
- » Limit of 5 containers per car
- » Separate and group items prior to drop off and label them
- » Go through the line only once
- » Properly seal containers to prevent leaking
- » Long wait times are possible
- » No walk-ups
- » Do not mix or consolidate products
- » Please let volunteers unload your car
- » Trailers longer than 16 feet will not be allowed
- » No contractor or business waste will be accepted
- » Haul containers in the back of vehicle away from passengers

MANAGER'S REPORT

Happy Fall y'all! It's hard to believe it's been around six months since our last community newsletter. Since then, a lot has happened. In June, we redrilled six new gas wells and installed three new wells. Earlier in the year, PEACE Homeschool Village toured the recycling facility. While there, they learned about proper recycling techniques and what goes on at a landfill. Looking ahead, we anticipate to start constructing a new cell in the first quarter of 2020 and our biannual Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Event is September 28. Before I go, I'd also like to take a moment to remind everyone about the importance of making sure their loads are covered by a tarp or tied down before they head out to the landfill or other destination. Not only is driving with an unsecured load against the law, it is extremely dangerous. Tarping or tying down your load helps keep our roadways safe, clean and saves taxpayers dollars.

NO Leaves & Yard Waste

Compost or mulch in your backyard, if not, bag and place with regular trash.



NO Paper Coffee Cups

Compost if possible or place in the trash.



NO Clothing & Bedding

Donate if they are still in good condition. Large quantities may require special disposal.
