Waste Management and Williamson County are partnering with the City of Cedar Park to host the “Keen on Clean” Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day. Below are guidelines as well as lists of accepted and not accepted items.

GUIDELINES

- If possible, bring products in original containers.
- Do not mix or consolidate products.
- Separate and group your items prior to drop-off and label them.
- Properly seal containers to prevent leaking.
- Haul containers in trunk or back of vehicle, away from passengers.
- Please let volunteers help you unload your items.
- Only go through the line one time.
- No trailers longer than 16-feet will be accepted.

Accepted

- Acids
- Aluminum
- Antifreeze
- Automotive tires (Car and Light Trucks up to 24” – Rims Removed)
- Batteries
- Cell phones, telephones
- Cleaning products such as polish, oven cleaner, drain opener, stain remover
- Plastics
- TVs (must be working, no wooden consoles or large screen TVs)
- Lawn and garden chemicals, herbicides and pesticides
- Used motor oil and filters
- Transmission and brake fluid
- Household products labeled “caution,” “warning” or “poison”
- Paint, lighter fluid, solvents and varnish
- Paper and cardboard
- Pool chemicals
- Pesticides

Not Accepted

- Agriculture chemicals
- Dioxins
- Containers larger than 5 gallons
- Explosives/fireworks/ammunitions
- Industrial or commercial/business waste
- No propane cylinders of any kind and no compressed gases
- Medical and pharmaceutical items
- Radioactive materials
- Tires with rims
- Asbestos-containing material



Goodwill will also be onsite to collect the following items: small furniture items, computer equipment, printers, gently used clothing, toys and clothing, fax machines, monitors, and household items (NO microwaves).

Residents should bring proof of Williamson County residency (driver's license or billing statement)

PLEASE NOTE: *Safety Vests Required at Landfill*

Starting April 1, all customers will be required to wear a safety vest when disposing of waste at the Williamson County Landfill. As part of Waste Management's commitment to safety, this new policy is being implemented across the nation to help ensure the safety of all of our customers.

Customers have several options to comply with this new safety policy:

1. Borrow a free Waste Management vest by simply presenting your driver's license to the gatehouse attendant in exchange for a vest. Return the vest to retrieve your driver's license.

2. Bring your own safety vest and inform the gatehouse attendant.
3. Purchase a safety vest at the Waste Management gatehouse for \$10 (plus tax).
