## News from Waste Management at the Williamson County Landfill

### Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day

Waste Management, together with the City of Cedar Park and Williamson County, will host a free Household Hazardous Waste Collection Saturday, April 30, 2016 at Gupton Stadium, located at 200 Gupton Way in Cedar Park (Gupton Way and E. Park Street.) Before coming to the event to drop off items, please keep the following in mind:



- Bring products in original containers if possible
- Limit of 5 containers per car
- Separate, group and label items
- Properly seal containers to prevent leaking
- Do not mix or consolidate products
- Haul containers in the trunk away from passengers
- Go through the line only once
- No walk-ups will be allowed
- Let the volunteers unload your items
- Trailers longer than 16-feet will not be allowed
- Contractor and business refuse will not be allowed

#### Acceptable

- Acids
- Aluminum
- Used motor oil & filters
- Antifreeze
- Batteries
- Automotive fluids
- Paint, solvents & varnish
- Lighter fluid
- Pool chemicals
- Auto tires\*
- Cleaning products
- Household products labeled "caution", "warning", or "poison"
- Brush
- E-waste such as computers, cell phones, printers, etc.

\*Car and truck tires must be 24" or smaller and have the wheels/ rims removed. A limit of 5 tires per car.

#### Not Acceptable

- Agricultural chemicals
- Dioxins
- Containers larger than 5 gallons
- Medical waste
- Pharmaceutical items
- Tires with wheels/rims attached
- Explosives, fireworks or ammunition
- Asbestos
- Industrial, commercial or business waste
- Radioactive materials
- Smoke alarms
- Any sort of propane cylinder
- Compressed gases

Recently, we completed an upgrade on our flare at the landfill and in March or April, we will be installing additional gas wells on the property to expand our current landfill gas collection system.

I would like to remind everyone that first Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) collection of the year is coming soon. The event will be April 30, 2016 at Cedar Park. This is a great opportunity for residents to clean out their garages and storage sheds. ## Air Quality Protection

Waste Management works to minimize potential odors associated with landfill operations in several ways. Because odors may be associated with landfill gas, the facility employs a landfill gas collection and control system. The system at Williamson County Landfill currently consists of a network of 70 landfill gas extraction wells installed in deposited waste areas to remove the landfill gas.

To minimize odors from newly deposited waste, the company covers new waste with a minimum of 6 inches of soil. In addition, landfill gas monitoring probes have been installed around the perimeter of the facility to detect potential mitigation of landfill gas. Both the collection and monitoring well networks are routinely expanded as needed.
