HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE COLLECTION DAY

SATURDAY, APRIL 28 – 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.

Williamson County and Waste Management are teaming with the City of Cedar Park to host a Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day on Saturday, April 28.

Below are guidelines as well as lists of accepted and not accepted items.

GUIDELINES

- If possible, bring products in original containers.
- Do not mix or consolidate products.
- Separate and group your items prior to drop-off and label them.
- Properly seal containers to prevent leaking.
- Haul containers in trunk or back of vehicle, away from passengers.

Accepted

- Acids
- Antifreeze
- Batteries
- Cleaning products such as polish, oven cleaner, drain opener, stain remover
- Lawn and garden chemicals, herbicides and pesticides
- Used motor oil and filters, transmission and brake fluid
- Household products labeled "caution," "warning" or "poison"
- Paint, lighter fluid, solvents and varnish
- Pool chemicals
- Computer-related items including monitors, computers, printers, scanners, hard drives, keyboards, mice, speakers, cords and cables, ink and toner cartridges
- Household electronics such as TVs (no console or excessive rear projection), VCR, DVD, stereo, telephone, cell phones
- Tires with rims removed (no more than 24-inches and limit of 5 tires per car)
- Metals for recycling

Not Accepted

- Agriculture chemicals
- Dioxins
- Containers larger than 5 gallons
- Explosives/fireworks/ammunitions
- Industrial or commercial/business waste
- No propane cylinders of any kind and no compressed gases
- Medical and pharmaceutical items
- Radioactive materials
- Tires with rims
- Asbestos-containing material



- Please let volunteers help you unload your items.
- Only go through the line one time.
- No trailers longer than 16-feet will be accepted.
- No contractors or business refuse will be accepted.

We are proud to announce that the Williamson County Landfill and Recycling Center is now a designated permanent collection site for the Hutto Food Pantry, located at the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Hutto. Donated items, including canned food, paper goods and toiletries, can be dropped off at the Recycling Center during normal operating hours: 7 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday and 7 a.m. to noon on Saturdays.



As spring arrives and you start gardening projects, we want to remind you that we have free mulch available for Williamson County residents. Some of this mulch is from recycled Christmas trees that were brought to the landfill after the holidays.
