News from Waste Management at the Williamson County Landfill

Don't miss the Free Household Hazardous Waste Cleanup Day



Waste Management and Williamson County will host a free Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day on Saturday, October 17, from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. You can bring household products labeled "caution," "warning" or "poison" to the Williamson County Central Maintenance Facility located at 3151 SE Inner Loop in Georgetown.

Please keep in mind:

- Bring products in original containers
- Separate, group and label items
- Properly seal containers to prevent leaking
- Do not mix or consolidate products
- Haul containers in trunk or truck bed, away from passengers
- Go through the line only once
- No walkups
- Please let volunteers unload your items
- Trailers longer than 16 feet will not be allowed
- No contractor or business refuse will be accepted

Here are the items you can and cannot bring to the free collection day:

ACCEPTED

- Acids
- Aerosols
- Automotive products such as gasoline, antifreeze, used motor oil and filters, transmission and brake fluid
- Batteries
- Cleaning products such as polish, oven cleaner, drain opener and stain remover
- Computers, printers, cell phones, etc.
- Fluorescent lamps and bulbs
- Household products labeled "caution," "warning," or "poison"
- Lawn and garden chemicals, herbicides and pesticides
- Paint, lighter fluid, solvents and varnish
- Pool chemicals

NOT ACCEPTED

- Agriculture chemicals
- Aluminum and other metals for recycling
- Asbestos-containing material
- Containers larger than 5 gallons
- Dioxins
- Explosives, fireworks or ammunition
- Household trash
- Industrial, commercial or business waste
- Medical waste and pharmaceutical items
- Paper or cardboard
- Plastics
- Propane cylinders of any kind and compressed gases
- Radioactive materials (smoke alarms)
- Televisions
- Tires

Dear Neighbors,

We hope everyone is settling back into their routine now that summer is over and school has started. We wish all the students a very successful year. And as always, we welcome school groups, Boy and Girl Scouts, and science organizations to tour the Williamson County Landfill and Recycling Center.

We have been busy at the landfill, installing new gas wells. The gas collection and control system is designed to remove the methane gas generated by decomposing waste. Collected gases are directed to and burned off at a central, high temperature flare.



Recycling Center Update

We recently made a few changes to items accepted at the Recycling Center. We no longer accept oil-based paints and fluorescent lamps and bulbs. These items, however, may be disposed of at the twice-a-year Household Hazardous Waste Collection Events. Fluorescent lamps and bulbs are also usually accepted for disposal at the same establishments from where they were purchased. Check with the business before delivering fluorescent lamps and bulbs for disposal.
