

# Williamson County Recycling

## ***ABOUT THE RECYCLING CENTER***

Williamson County opened the Hutto Recycling Center in 2005, and in June 2009, Waste Management began operating the facility.

The Recycling Center has kept more than 700 tons of recyclable material from becoming part of the landfill.

## **The Hutto Recycling Center and Williamson County Landfill Hours**

Monday – Friday: 7 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Saturday: 7 to noon

Sunday: Closed

The Recycling Center is located at the Landfill entrance, on the west side of 1660, between Highway 79 and Highway 29.



## ***E- RECYCLING***

The Williamson County Recycling Center has an e-waste recycling program that allows citizens to drop off obsolete electronics.



## ***ACCEPTED ITEMS AT THE RECYCLING CENTER***

- Used oil and scrap metal
- Cardboard, newspapers and magazines
- Aluminum cans and plastic
- E-waste, such as computers, monitors, cell phones, keyboards and cables
- Paint and batteries
- Fluorescent light bulbs
- Refrigerators, freezers and air conditioners (\$40 fee)



## ***ASPHALT SHINGLES, AND C&D RECYCLING***

The Williamson County Recycling Center is also home to two pilot commercial projects: Asphalt Shingles Recycling and Construction and Demolition Recycling.

# Williamson County Landfill

## LANDFILL HISTORY

The Williamson County Landfill is a Type 1 municipal solid waste landfill that accepts non-hazardous household, commercial and industrial and special wastes. The Landfill is approximately 575 acres, with a total landfill footprint of 423 acres. It is owned by Williamson County and operated by Waste Management.

According to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ), Central Texas residents generate roughly 8 pounds of waste per person per day. Waste Management helps manage that waste in a safe and environmentally friendly manner.



## ENVIRONMENTAL CONTROLS AT THE LANDFILL

Waste Management employs stringent environmental control technologies at the landfill to protect groundwater, storm water, air quality and the environment.

### Groundwater Protection

- Compacted clay and very durable, High Density Polyethylene plastic lines the landfill along the bottom and sides
- Leachate system to collect liquids formed by natural decomposition of waste
- Regularly collects and analyzes groundwater from monitoring wells

### Storm Water Management

- Designed for 100-year flood event
- Storm water detention ponds, drainage terraces, rock dams manage run-off

## Odor Controls

- Landfill gas collection and control system removes gas created by decomposing waste
- Blower system brings gas to central, high-temperature flare that safely destroys gas

## Keeping Our Community Clean

- Fences to prevent windblown litter
- Daily litter pick up within two miles of landfill entrance
- Landscaping
