
1. Find a way to reduce using something.

MANAGER'S REPORT

Happy spring from Williamson County Landfill! Things have been moving along here as usual at the site. In January, we added eight new landfill gas extraction wells and approximately 2600 feet of pipelines. We plan to continue installing more wells in the summer. We also finished a new 12-acre landfill cell at the end of 2020. We plan to start placing waste in the new cell in April.

Our landfill team is looking forward to seeing you at the Household Hazardous Waste event in late April. As a reminder, this event is for Williamson County residents only. I encourage everyone in the county to clean out their garages, laundry rooms, sheds, and take advantage of this event. There is a limit of five containers per vehicle, and all containers must be less than five gallons. You can find out more information about the event on the ad below as well as our website.

Last but not least, Earth Day is this month. I encourage everyone to take a moment to decide and commit to something they can do differently to benefit the planet this year. I plan to reduce the number of paper napkins I grab at restaurants, and I encourage you to do something beneficial for the planet as well.
