### Manager's Report

The summer months are here, and we are preparing for another hot season at the landfill. We began constructing a new seven-acre cell, which should be completed in October. We have also identified the date for our next Household Hazardous Waste event: **October 12.**

WM and the county will host the event at the Williamson County Central Maintenance Facility at 3151 SE Inner Loop in Georgetown.

We've also had a lot of rain across the state during the first half of the year. We will update the page anytime the landfill is closed or when it is only accessible by four-wheel-drive vehicles.

### Summer Safety Tips

As the summer months heat up, it's crucial to reiterate the importance of staying hydrated and taking steps to avoid heat stress. When working outside, consuming 4 cups (32 ounces) of water per hour is recommended. Avoid drinks with excess caffeine, sugar, or alcohol. Work in the shade when possible and wear a wide-brimmed hat for protection from the sun. Watch for warning signs of heat stress with yourself and others.

### HHW Event Makes a Big Impact

On March 16, Williamson County Landfill hosted its first hazardous household waste event (HHW) of 2024. Four hundred sixty-five cars full of residents safely disposed of 4,032 lbs. of flammable liquids, 25,502 lbs. of paint and paint-related products, and over 3,000 lbs. of pesticides/herbicides.

The twice-a-year event is a partnership between Williamson County and WM's Williamson County Landfill. "The event is significant to Williamson County residents," said Landfill Operations Manager Louis McClure. "Every year, residents line up earlier and earlier and bring more items, which is great because it shows they care about their community." Ultimately, the event helped safely dispose of a combined total of 37,284 lbs. of HHW. By encouraging responsible handling of hazardous materials, we safeguard our environment and promoted a cleaner, safer community.
